Beam Project CIC is a survivor-led nonprofit on a mission to reduce child sexual abuse. All our work is driven by the notion of what we think would have helped us.

Our Dare To Ask workshops are designed and delivered by people with firsthand experience of child sexual abuse. Our work has already led to some cases of sexual abuse being disclosed sooner than they otherwise would've been. This is our main metric of impact!

We want every frontline professional to feel ready to intervene when there are suspicions or knowledge of abuse. The antithesis to this vision is 'I thought something was going on, but I didn't know how to approach the issue and I was afraid of getting it wrong, so I didn't say anything.' Our training empowers frontline professionals to overcome their discomfort and to respond with confidence when the stakes are high and real.

OUR OFFER TO YOU

We offer a full-day workshop for up to 60 participants that will equip your team to encourage and respond to disclosures of child sexual abuse at work. A sample schedule is as follows:

09:30-10:15: Our direct accounts of abuse and disclosure, including the factors which kept us silent and the missed opportunities for an adult to help.

10:15-11:00: group discussion on the barriers that prevent children from disclosing.

11:00-12:15: Presentation on how to help children to speak about their experiences.

12:15-13:00: lunch break

13:00-14:00: Presentation and discussion on how to respond to disclosures, including role-play exercise.

14:00-15:00: Presentation by a local service provider to encourage community cohesion when handling cases of abuse (this varies by event).

15:00-15:45: Small group role-play simulating our disclosure scenarios. We practice this in real time so that participants are emotionally ready to handle live disclosures.

15:45-17:00: Our feedback on the role of professionals, the court process, and action steps for your team to take from the very next day.
